Virtual Method Considerations

Activities for which the MDDs permit virtual delivery

With the unprecedented circumstances surrounding the outbreak of the COVID-19 coronavirus, recent conversation with CMMI Partners has focused largely on the remote delivery of appraisals. Through this conversation, it has been identified that more work must be done to highlight those areas of the benchmark appraisal methods—SCAMPI V1.3b A and CMMI V2.0 Benchmark appraisals—that are permitted to be delivered via virtual methods. Additionally, on 17 March 2020, CMMI Institute approved remote delivery of all benchmark appraisal activities, including those that normally require the appraisal team to be on-site. Fully remote delivery is now permitted on a temporary pilot basis **through 30 September 2020**.

The below section contains a list of Phase 2 and 4 activities from each of the Method Definition Documents (MDDs) that are normally allowed to be performed remotely, as well as activities—highlighted in yellow—that are temporarily allowed to be performed remotely during the pilot period. Phase 1 and Phase 3 activities for all appraisals may be performed remotely at all times.

The key to a successful virtual appraisal is thorough and detailed planning, preparation, and testing. Mitigation, contingency, and work-around approaches must be identified and in place prior to the Conduct Appraisal phase. ATLs must analyze, plan for, and monitor activities where virtual delivery is allowed only during the temporary pilot. Virtual delivery requires *more* planning, not less.


MDD Excerpt, 1.1.1 Comply with CMMI Appraisal Method Requirements, Virtual Appraisal Delivery Constraints

Benchmark Appraisals and Sustainment Appraisals shall not be 100% virtual and must follow the requirements below. 100% virtual organizations are defined as organizations with no physical OU address or facility, and where all staff work remotely. OUs that are geographically disbursed with any physical address or facility do not qualify as a virtual organization.

Given the current state of technology and recognizing that organizations may be 100% virtual, appraisal activities must strike a balance between the cost and business constraints of virtual organizations against the requirements for fidelity and quality of CMMI-based appraisals. For critical activities in Benchmark Appraisals and Sustainment Appraisals, the ATL and appraisal team must be physically co-located for all full team consensus activities at the OU site, beginning with practice characterization at the OU level. Refer to below from the MDD, Figure 7: Team Consensus Requirements for Characterizations and Ratings.

- If the OU is 100% virtual, then the ATL must coordinate with the Appraisal Sponsor to identify a suitable physical location for the appraisal team that will enable effective and efficient communication and coordination with each other and with the OU.
- In situations where the OU is geographically disbursed, the ATL must coordinate with the Appraisal Sponsor to identify a base of operations for the appraisal team which is, at a minimum, at one of the OU physical sites.
- If the appraisal has a scenario that does not fit the above, the ATL must submit a written request with detailed rationale to the Quality Team at quality@cmmiinstitute.com, and obtain approval before proceeding.
